CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE BAY COUNTY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

ARTICLE I - NAME

This organization shall be known as "The Bay County Genealogical Society."

ARTICLE II - OBJECTS AND PURPOSES

The objects and purposes of this Society shall be:

- 1. To assist and encourage members in their genealogical research;
- 2. To assist others by collecting and preserving genealogical and historical data;
- 3. To cooperate with other genealogical societies and to assist the area libraries in expanding their genealogical section.

ARTICLE III - BASIS OF ORGANIZATION

- The Bay County Genealogical Society shall be conducted as a nonprofit organization.
- 2. All the facilities of the Society shall be available equally to each member in good standing.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP

- 1. Any person interested in genealogy, history or biography, either amatter or professional, may become a member of the Society by paying the annual dues to the treasurer.
- 2. Only currently active members may hold office or vote.
- 3. Dues will be determined at the June meeting for the ensuing year, which will begin in January each year.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

- 1. The officers of the Society shall be the <u>President</u>, the <u>Vice-President</u>, the <u>Recording Secretary</u>, the <u>Treasurer</u>, and the <u>Editor</u>. Any additional officers as may be deemed necessary shall be elected by a majority vote at any regular business meeting.
- 2. All current Officers, Chairman of the Standing Committees, and the immediate Past President shall constitute the Executive Board.
- 3. All officers shall be elected annually at the June meeting, shall take office at the <u>next</u> meeting and continue in office for one year or until successors are elected and qualify.
- 4. The duties of the Officers shall be such as are indicated by their respective titles.
- 5. All officers, upon retiring from office shall deliver to their successors all monies, accounts, records, books, papers or other property which belong to the Society
- erty which belong to the Society.

 6. A simple majority of all votes cast shall be necessary to constitute an elect ion.

7. Vacancies in office other than the President, shall be filled by appointment of the President to fill out the unexpired term, with the approval of the Executive Board. In case of an unexpired term of the President, the Vice President shall become the President to fill out the unexpired term of the President.

ARTICLE VI - MEETINGS

The regular meetings of the Society shall be held monthly, with the time and place determined by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE VII - QUORUM

Five currently active members, including any officers present, shall constitute a quorum at any regular meeting.

ARTICLE VIII - FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year shall begin with the first meeting of the calendar year.

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS

The Constitution and By-Laws may be amended at any meeting of the Society by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting. Notice of the proposed amendment shall be provided members in written form at least 7 days before the meeting.

ARTICLE X - PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE

All meetings shall be conducted according to Roberts Rules of Order, as amended.
