



## HeritageHub

As of April 6, 2025, there are 376 members in the Society's Facebook group. As mentioned in a previous column, a person must be a group member to post something on the Facebook page, and even though all 376 members aren't posting, they do come to see what's going on.


Besides postings from people asking for help in their research, there are postings about Society activities such as genealogy classes for the public, upcoming doings at the Society meetings, what's new on the website, etc.

#### Website (baymigensoc.com)

Since the last issue of the "Clarion", the following two additions have been placed on the website. The first are items from the July 14, 1931, issue of the Bay City Times and the second are 1904 marriage indexes and 1904 marriage records. Marriages now span from 1904 through 1933, inclusive. Unless somebody wants to continue adding them to the collection, no more will be added.

Since the beginning of the year, there have been 162 site visitors. 123 of those visitors are first timers. Here are the countries where the viewers are located, Bangladesh (5), Canada (5), China (1),

United Kingdom (1), Poland (1), and United States (149).
