This issue's column will give a description of what appears on the Bay County Genealogical Society (BCGS) website. The site is intended to promote the Society and to provide some genealogy related documents. There are a total of twelve pages. Nine are viewable by all site visitors and three are viewable only by current members.

Viewable by All Site Visitors

The "Home" page is where people usually land when they first get there. Therefore, it informs the viewer about the Society, upcoming meetings, what is new on the website, and information about what was learned at the last Michigan Genealogical Council Delegate meeting. Under the "About Us" tab is the "Meetings" page and the "Membership" page. The "Meetings" page is where the monthly meetings dates are located, and how to attend the hybrid meetings. The "Membership" page provides information on how to join the Society. The "Publications" page has a list of all publications available for sale. All of them are also available at the Wirt Library in downtown Bay City, Michigan.

Under the "Research" tab are the "Queries", "Research Links", Marriage Records, and "Marriage Records Index" pages. The "Queries" page informs the viewer on how and where to get help. The "Research Links" page lists some genealogy related websites. The "Marriage Index" page is where viewers can see indexes to Bay County marriage records. The "Marriage Records" page is where the viewer can get access to transcribed Bay County marriage records that match the marriage record indexes. Currently 1912-1933. The "Genealogy Room" page provides information about the Wirt Library genealogy room, including the hours available and what is there. The "Newsletters" page is where BCGS newsletters dating from 1979 to the present can be viewed. There is also the current issue of the Michigan Genealogical Council newsletter.

Viewable by Current Members (Password required)

Under the "BCGS Members" tab is a "Handouts" page, which contains an assortment of handouts provided by presenters. The Members only section also contains other documents.

That is what viewers can find by visiting the site. It is meant to be fluid. Meaning everything can change. Suggestions are always accepted. They may not be acted upon, but they will be considered.

A Look Back at Our Last Four Meetings:

April 12th: Kris Rzepczynski – Digital News (Online Newspapers)



Kris discussed the various sites available for looking at digitized newspaper articles. Some can be accessed from the Library of MI if you have a membership card. Other places to seek out news articles are national, state, & local repositories. Kris suggested "Keep an open mind – News articles could be found outside the area you are searching."

May 10th: Jessica M. Trotter – Cluster Research, or Discovering You're Related to the Whole Block.

Many of our ancestors migrated with family groups, religious communities or communities reacting to changes in their environment but their relationships are not always obvious. Jessica suggests that when we research our direct lines using all the usual records (census, vital records, land records, probate, naturalization, passenger list, military records) we pay close attention and research siblings, in-laws, witnesses, friends and neighbors. Look for common birthplaces, surnames and first name patterns. Jessica showed us some great examples of how she found more relatives using this strategy!

June 14th: Potluck & Brown Bag Auction

MODERN WOODMEN OF AMERICA FORMED IN BAY CITY

Modern Woodmen of America is a benevolent and benefit fraternity that has been in existence since 1883 and was originally formed in Iowa. Before it was formally organized and a friend or relative died unexpectedly, many who knew the person would 'pass the hat' to take up a collection to help the remaining family.

The first chapter in the city of Bay City to organize was met with success. Messer's A. E. Benson and C. O. Rathburn were the first organizers.¹

There were 27 men who stated they would be willing to form a chapter and when it was finally formed there were 44 total members from the Bay City area. Those names included: McDowell, LeBaron, Doughty, Grant, Wallace, Clark, Gardner, David, Mann, Armstrong, McDonald, Huckins, Betz, Holms, Jean, Bally, Schmidt, Hewitt, Peak and Hammond.

The chapter was known as "Valley Camp, Modern Woodmen of America".²

The first claim that was paid in Bay City was for Michael Eckinger who died from injuries sustained at GH Morill and Co's planing mill in December of 1893. He left a wife and three children at home and the survivors were paid a total of \$4,000.00. Michael was born in Germany and he and his family are buried in Oakridge Cemetery in Bay City.³

The first death claim for the nationwide organization was for Willie Warner of Niles, Michigan which happened 14 June 1891.
